**AN OLD FRIEND IN BASEBALL GAME**

Here is Frank Small, a Pitcher Whom Old Nationals Brought to St. John

(Bangor Commercial)

Frank L. Small, familiarly known as "Jocko" in his college days at what is now the University of Maine, and who put that institution on the map in the baseball world as one of the most famous pitchers of his day, has been in Bangor for a few days, on his return from the north woods, where he has been connected with lumbering operations on the Coe & Plunger holdings.

Mr. Small graduated from the University of Maine in the class of 1888 and since that time has been in various parts of the country, having returned last year from New Mexico, where he had been in mining operations which were closed on account of the war.

After leaving college he was connected with professional baseball for two or three seasons but for several years was located at Hampton, Va., Institute as instructor in mechanical engineering.

Since that time one of the big jobs that he has undertaken and carried through was the installation of the heating and lighting plant at Wesley College, which was the gift of John D. Rockefeller.

Mr. Small's baseball work while at the University of Maine was one of the most notable of any player at that institution. His backstop was the late Seymour Rogers, a former Stetson boy, who although considerably lighter than Small was able to do most effective work in catching the very speedy deliveries from the box. During their work on the team at the University of Maine won the championship of the Maine colleges, and in one season particularly Mr. Small won the championship after the first two games of the series had been dropped. In one of the games played in Bangor against Bowdoin, he struck out 12 of the opposing team.

During his college career he played with the Portland team in the New England league, and made so enviable a reputation that a strong effort was made by the Boston National team to secure his release from Portland. The Boston manager was unable to procure his release that season and the following year was Small's most remarkable one in the Maine college series.

After graduation Mr. Small played with the St. John team and coached one of the teams in New Brunswick. He dropped out of professional ball playing to accept the position at Hampton Institute, and has since been engaged largely in engineering and mining projects, returning from New Mexico last fall.

Mr. Small will go from here to his former home in Freeport, where he has a son living, his wife died some years ago.

Small and Rogers were imported to St. John by the old Nationals as battery in the days when St. John was really baseball mad.

William S. Lawrence, of Moncton, is dead, leaving two sons and two daughters. The sons are—Edgar, W. E., of Montreal, and Arthur E., of Alton, Mass. The daughters are—Mrs. Neil Powell, of Toronto, and Mrs. Daniel Shaw, of Moncton.
