Wesley College, Winnipeg, was founded in 1873, and for a few years continued its educational work, which, however, had at length to be abandoned on account of insufficient equipment. The need of suitable provision for this institution is one of the most pressing wants of Canadian Methodism. The Manitoba Conference, at its recent session, placed itself in hearty co-operation with the Board of Trustees, to establish the College in an active and honorable position. contributions have already been made to form a Sustentation Fund for three years, during which time the Endowment Fund is to be materially increased. The first students from this Institution have just been sent up to the Provincial University for graduation—two—and at the last sessional examinations four scholarships were taken by the students of this College. The prospect is favorable of a large increase in the attendance next year. Number of students the past session, 35, of whom 20 are studying to prepare for the ministry.

The Albert College, Belleville, was begun by the former Methodist Episcopal Church of Canada, in 1857, as the Belleville Seminary. In 1866 it acquired the name of Albert College, with limited University powers, and in 1871 it obtained full University powers. In 1885, in conservence of the Methodist Union of 1883, it became incorporated with Victoria University, continuing most efficiently its operations since then as a higher Seminary and affiliated with the
