



Washington, May 2.—Conviction of U. S. Senator Trueman H. Newberry for conspiracy to violate the federal corrupt practices act was set aside today by the supreme court. The conviction of sixteen other defendants also was set aside. The court held that Congress was without power to regulate primaries.
