More Money For The Clergymen

Synod Decided on \$200 Increase in Stipends, Bringing Minimum up to \$1,000—Reports Adopted

At the afternoon session of the Anglican synod yesterday it was decided to add \$200 to the minimum stipend for the clergy. In the evening the synod sermon was delivered by Bishop Williams of Quebec.

Rev. Canon Smithers presented the report of the standing committee and dealt largely with the sale and transfer of property. The report said that tenders had been asked for the sale in whole or in part of lands known as the Perth Glebe, and also tenders for the hardware and logs standing thereon.

The report of the executive committee was next read by Canon Smithers, and the report of the Board of Missions was next read by the secretary, Canon Smithers, and was adopted. It is in part:

Appointments—The Reverend H. T. Montgomery to Derby and Blackville; the Reverend G. W. Fisher to St. Mary's, York county; the Reverend H. H. Gillies to Cambridge and Waterbury; the Reverend H. T. Buckland to Gagetown; the Reverend C. G. Lawrence to Hampton; the Reverend W. Tonnin, to Shediac; the Reverend L. A. Foster, to Gordon and Lorne; the Reverend A. M. Dutton, to Springfield; the Reverend John Rees-Jones, to Wilmet, New Brunswick.

Vacancies—At the time of making this report the following parishes and missions are vacant, viz., Bright, Hillsboro, and Hartwick; Prince William and Dunsmuir; New Bedford; Burton and Maugerville; Drummond; Hammond River, and Richmond. Since the last meeting of the Board the mission of Salisbury and Havelock has become vacant through the death of the Reverend Coleman.

The treasurer's report for the year 1918, showed that there was a substantial credit balance of \$50 each being given to those clergymen in the Diocese receiving a stipend of \$1,000 or less, and who have to keep a horse and automobile in the discharge of their duties.

The report showed a total income for all purposes, not including endowments, of \$112,828.78. The statement of missionary funds presented by Charles Coster showed estimates for 1919 totalling \$44,500. The apportionments for the diocese are:

missions for the year 1919 are \$16,500, while for the M. S. C. C. the apportionments are \$6,400, making a total of \$22,900.

The report of the finance committee was next read by Canon Harding, and was adopted as read. Among the apportionments made by the board during the year was for improvements at Rothsay, the rebuilding of the farm house at a cost not exceeding \$4,000, the installation of a septic tank and the installation of a new pump and engine to improve the water supply.

The report was read by Rev. H. A. Cody and was adopted as read. A portion of the report is as follows:

"The board of the church has to report that last year was the most successful one in the history of the church book room. The total receipts were \$3,553.98. This is a remarkable increase when compared with the last year when the total receipts were only \$810.

Canon Armstrong next read the report of the board of education, which was adopted. The report said:

"That His Lordship the Bishop, Rev. Canon Daniel, A. C. Skelton, H. B. Schofield, J. M. Robinson, P. R. L. Fairweather and H. F. Puddington, were appointed as the executive committee of the Rothery Collegiate School.

"That the school fees were increased to \$375 per annum, except for clergymen's sons, which remain at the old figure, viz., \$200 per annum."

Rev. W. R. Hibbard, the headmaster of the Rothery Collegiate, read his report for the year.
