

Prices obtained for furs at the Funsten anction fur sale in New York show big advances over the bids obtained in April, Alaska seal skins, for instance, were 30 per cent higher, blue fox 135 per cent, ermine 40 per cent, elichential 100 per cent, beaver 40 per cent, and, in fact, almost every kind of skin sold at substantial advances over the spring auction. This was the largest sale in the history of the fur auction in New York and comprised skins from practically all the fur-producing countries, the total value of which amounted to \$15,334,550.
