Johnson's Marriage Scandal

Washington, Dec. 11.—A denunciation of the legal procedure under which "a brown-skinned, black-skinned, thick-lipped, brutal, hearted African can walk into an office of the law and demand an edit guaranteeing him legal wedlock to a white woman" was one of many sensational features of a speech today by Representative Roddenberry of Georgia, in favor of a resolution he had introduced earlier to prohibit intermarriage of whites and negroes.

The measure, a direct result of the recent marriage of Jack Johnson, the negro pugilist, with a white girl, did not get a vote, but it elicited a full day's proceedings. Mr. Roddenberry declared that "no brutality, infamy or degree of degradation of the days of southern slavery possessed such villainous characteristics and atrocious qualities as the perversion of that marriage by the laws of this country."

Johnson's Lawyers Leave Him

Chicago, Dec. 12.—Jack Johnson's attorneys, W. R. Anderson and E. H. Wright, appeared in the United States District Court today to ask that their names be stricken from the records as counsel for the fighter. The lawyers, who are both colored, said that Johnson's recent marriage to Lucille Cameron, a white girl, was disapproved by them to an extent that they did not care to be longer associated with him. Wright and Anderson represented Johnson in the white slave cases yet to be heard.

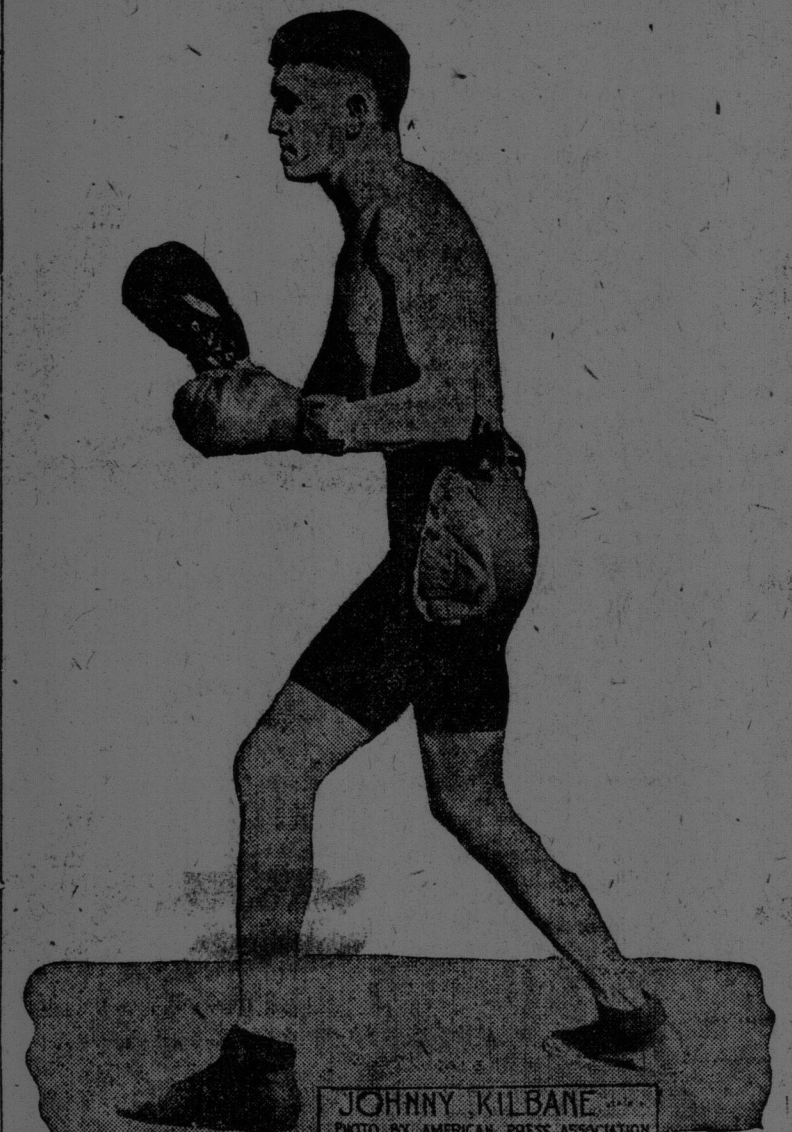

Two More Illuminating Disclosures Are Made In The Commons

LAND AND WHARF BOUGHT

See the Prices Paid in Looting of The Treasury—Highway Bill up Again—Sir Wilfrid Today on the Navy Bill

Ottawa, Dec. 11.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier will deliver what is expected to be one of the greatest speeches of his career on Thursday afternoon, when he will rise in the House of Commons to move an amendment to the Borden Naval resolution. It is expected that the reply will be delivered by Hon. J. D. Hazen or Hon. G. E. Foster, probably the latter.

Is Borden Withholding Information?

Whether the government has yet taken parliament and the country into frank and full confidence in relation to its naval proposals was the subject of a significant interchange between Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Premier Borden while the house met last afternoon on the matter.

Sir Wilfrid read the Canadian Associated Press despatch chronicling the reply of Premier Borden to the question put by Mr. Lee, ex-civil lord of the admiralty, in which the British premier stated that certain arrangements of a railway department were read, declaring that the land was not worth \$100 per acre. But despite this, the government had paid \$100,000 per acre for it.

Hon. Mr. Cochrane moved the adjournment of the debate until he could get further information on the matter.

Sir Sinclair, Guyabero, in moving for all state documents in connection with the Panama canal tolls, strongly protested against the action of the United States, and suggested that Canada might retaliate by imposing tolls on American vessels using Canadian canals.

Premier Borden, in reply, stated that the Canadian protest had been submitted to him verbally and in writing, to the British colonial secretary, and that pending a reply from Washington to the British protest he would not discuss the matter.

Highways Bill Up Again.

Hon. Mr. Cochrane introduced the government bill to amend and assist the improvement of highways.

"Are we to assume that this is the same bill as was introduced last year, or are we to expect that it has been improved?" queried Sir Wilfrid.

The minister said that some amendments had been reached by the house in its consideration last year, and these might be embodied.

Hon. Mr. Hazen introduced an amendment to the customs and fisheries protection act under which foreign vessels other than those of the United States, as provided by the treaty of 1818, will be prohibited from fishing in the Canadian waters affected by that treaty.

Mr. Barrihan introduced an amendment to the dominion elections act to do away with the candidate's deposit of \$200 in provinces where such deposit is not demanded in provincial elections.

Mr. Meighen introduced an amendment to the railway act to give the railway companies the right to condemn land for the purpose of the killing of cattle on railway lines rests upon the railway company.
