WHAT BECOMES OF THE AUTOMOBILES? There Are Now 405,000 Registered in the United States and Probably 50,000 Not Listed. New York, Nov. 14—The problem of what becomes of the automobiles was discussed before the House of Representatives by J. N. Willys. Some valuable and interesting facts concerning the production and disposal of motor vehicles were presented by Mr. Willys, who said that 405,000 automobiles were registered in the United States, with 50,000 not registered. Mr. Willys places the value of exports for 1912 at nearly \$20,000,000 and estimates the entire production in the United States during 1912 at 250,000.

FOUR DIE IN STEAMER FIRE. Dover, England, Nov. 14—In a fire aboard the steamer Wentworth early today, four members of the crew were fatally injured by smoke, and four other sailors were seriously injured.
