FARMS ARE ALL READY FOR THEM

Fifty Families for West Arrive on S.S. Empress of Ireland—Steamer Made a Fast Voyage

With a large passenger list and the largest number of home seekers that ever left the eastern side of Western Canada, the big C. P. R. liner Empress of Ireland, Captain Farster, arrived from Liverpool via Halifax this morning.

There are seventy families of home seekers, 239 in all, and they are en route to C. P. R. ready-made farms in Alberta. They are in charge of Archibald S. Walter, representing the C. P. R. Land & Colonization department.

While the maximum amount of money required was \$10,000 all had much more than that, some carrying all the way from \$2,500 to \$3,000. All are married people.

These farms are eighty acres in size. On each farm is a house of four rooms and a barn capable of accommodating eight head of cattle. Each farm is fenced in and each has a full fifty acres have already been planted, two-thirds of wheat, and the remainder oats and potatoes.

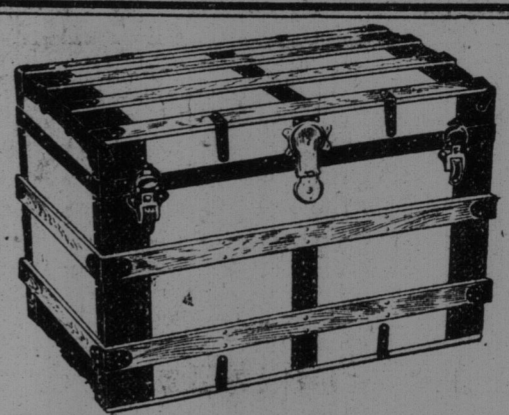
NEWS AGENTS' ARRESTED
