

## SCOTS LOOKING TOWARD CANADA FOR NEW HOMES

Rev. George Adam Talks on Immigration Over C. N. R. Radio

Thousands of Youngsters Available as Potential New Citizens.

MONTREAL, May 14.—"I have been talking Canada throughout Scotland all winter. Inevitably the rural areas, speaking at cross roads, in village clubs, halls and schools. To keep appointments was often difficult through misty rains alternating with sleet and snow. No matter how bad the weather the audiences were always good. More often than not the meeting place, such as it was, was overcrowded. Such is the interest the people have in Canada. From Wigtown-

shire to the Western Isles it was all the same." These were the introductory remarks of Rev. George Adam, formerly of Emmanuel church, Drummond street, on the occasion of his talk over the radio from CNRM, the Canadian National Wireless centre in Montreal, delivered last night.

### SCOTLAND FOUND EAGER.

Mr. Adam had been in Scotland for some time addressing many meetings which had been organized for the purpose of directing attention towards Canada, and of making known the opportunities available in the Dominion. It was for the purpose of explaining what had been done and of outlining the situation in Scotland that Mr. Adam spoke through the microphone. In continuing the speaker said that there are so many Scottish people in the Dominion that the people left behind are eager to learn all they can of the country that has given hospitality and home to their own kith and kin.

### OPPORTUNITY LACKING.

At a further stage Mr. Adam said to his radio audience, "the farms of Scotland are relatively so few that the possibility of a ploughman becoming a farmer is remote indeed, not for lack of ability, but of opportunity. Every acre of available land held either as tenant or proprietor, is handed for the most part from father to son. Canada has room in her vast alluvial acreage for many thousands more than are here now, that is certain, and there is a wholesome desire to enter into possession on the part of a hardy, industrious and thrifty folk. How satisfactorily

to relate the opportunity on the one side with the desire on the other, is the problem that faces governments and people alike.

### ONLY FARMERS WANTED.

"Moreover Canada welcomes at present only the farmer and the farmhand, and rightly, while many such as I have said, are eager to come here. It must be understood there is a shortage of farm labor in Scotland itself, although there is a surplus of population in the country to judge by the large number of people who are unemployed. Among the latter class, tens of thousands strong, there can be no reasonable doubt but that there are thousands of youngsters who are good potential agriculturists. This is the class which at present, it seems to me, offers the most favorable recruiting ground for procuring Canadian settlers."

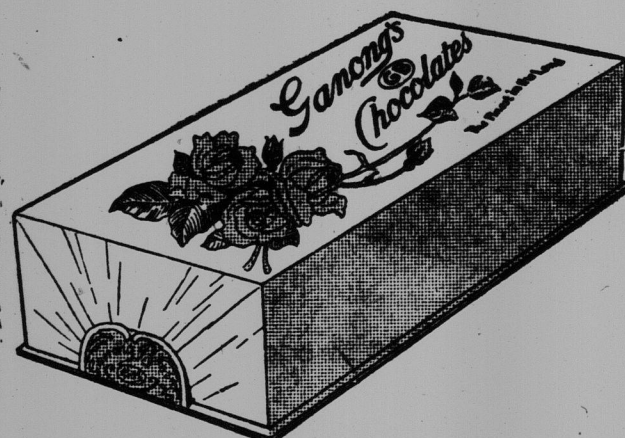
