MILLIONS FOR LUXURIES.
Canada spends approximately \$28,000,000 annually on soft drinks. The cost of cigars, cigarettes, tobacco, etc., consumed in 1920 amounted to \$75,605,762, according to manufacturers' data, and the total price at retail would be considerably higher. Canada's bill for candies, biscuits, confectionery and ice cream is placed at \$45,206,617, according to a compilation covering the year 1918. Taxable amusements claimed \$44,030,289 in 1921. The amount expended on automobiles, based on the price at which the manufacturers sold their products, amounted to \$161,726,258 in 1920.

These figures indicate that the Canadian public has a considerable amount of money to spend on things that are not absolutely essential, but which add much to the pleasure of life. The above figures serve to show that the Dominion's market is far more extensive than that of many other countries with a much larger population. A British financial writer stated recently that Canada should be concerned with the production of furniture in Canada last year at a cost value of \$25,166,305.

CANADIAN LABOR DISOWNED SOVIET

Unanimous Approval Given by Trades Congress to Condemnatory Resolution—No Communism Wanted.

(Montreal Gazette.)

Without a word of discussion or a voice of dissent, the Dominion Trades and Labor Congress went on record as wholly and totally opposed to the Communist policies of the Red Trade Union International of Moscow, and any Soviet ideas being tolerated within their ranks in Canada. The vote was taken at the morning session of the Congress yesterday in the big hall of the Assistance Publique.

The unanimous approval of the resolution, as presented by the Executive Council of the Congress, came as a distinct surprise, for it was fully expected that a lengthy debate would be started and kept up. It was the voice of union labor expressing openly its challenge to red, radical, Bolshevik and extremist tactics, and there was a hush for a moment immediately after the "aye," proclaiming the resolution carried.

It was Delegate J. W. Wilkinson, Vancouver, a member of the executive council, who introduced the subject, drawing attention to a report of the council, headed "Communist Activities in Canada." He said that there are at present three independent parties in Canada, which could be classified as "lefted": the Workers' Party of Canada, the Workers' Educational League, and the Trade Union Educational League. It had been thought, he said, that the last two organizations were identical, but investigations had disclosed that they are separate bodies.

"The adherents of the Communist movements," said Delegate Wilkinson, "are deliberately, whether openly or secretly, endeavoring to bring about the formation of trade unions for the furthering of their own propaganda. We are not here to tolerate the radicals; if they want their ideas spread it is their own business; but if they think they can make use of the labor unions of Canada for this purpose they are greatly mistaken, and it is about time this Congress declared its stand on the question, once and for all."

The speaker thought that the Communist sympathizers on this continent might have achieved far more success had they not attempted to break down and disrupt the legitimate trade unions in order to advance the idea of One Big Union. Instead of winning in-

dependently, he continued, they have re-sisted within the international union ranks, and by subtle movements from within have tried to split up the organization.

Tolerance Abused.

"These people's place," he said, "is right outside the trade unions. My personal experience has been such that I do not propose to be drawn into a movement of this kind. We treated them with tolerance and forbearance, hoping to have a minimum of disruption; but to be regarded merely as a sign of weakness."

"The Communists," he went on, "are talking a lot about democracy and freedom and liberty, but my experience of the trade unions; but, by first destroying confidence in the methods established by years of experience, to utilize them to bring the workers of Canada under the control of the Red Trade Union International of Moscow."
