Sunshine in London.—The values for the entire year show that the average number of hours of bright sunshine is 1,214, or 27 per cent. of the possible amount. The largest number recorded in any year of the 14 was in 1887, when there were 1,407, while the smallest was in that notoriously dismal year 1879, when there were only 984. Taking the year through the average daily amount of sunshine at Greenwich is little more than three hours and a quarter, or less than three hours and a quarter, or less than thalf the quantity possible on the shorest December day. Thus, if the sun were to shine all the year through for the same number of hours as the highest possible in mid-winter, we should get twice as much bright weather as we actually experience; and the results of an average of 14 years' observations show that there are 94 days out of the 365, or more than a fourth of the year, upon which the solar rays are either altogether absent or are too feeble to leave any mark on the recording instrument.—Fredk J. Brodie, in Nature.


