MT. A. RHODES SCHOLARS.

F. P. Day, of N. S. and Arthur Motyer of Bermuda are the Appointments of the Methodist College.

Mt. Allison University has this year the singular good fortune to send two Rhodes scholars to Oxford. The Bermuda scholarship has been awarded by the trustees to Arthur Motyer of the class of '05, and the faculty has selected as the Mt. Allison scholar Frank Parker Day.

Mr. Day is the son of the Rev. George Day of North East Harbor, N. S., a native of St. John West, and was born at Shubenacadie, N. S., on May 9th, 1881, being thus in the twenty-fourth year of his age. Mr. Day prepared for college at the county academy of Lunenburg and at the University of the Maritimes by standing third at the provincial examinations out of 34 successful candidates for the Grade A academic license. In 1900 he entered the University of Mt. Allison as a senior matriculant, and graduated in 1903, taking first-class honors in philosophy and making an excellent record as a good all-round student. During the current collegiate year Mr. Day has been taking at his alma mater a post-graduate course in classics and mathematics.

Mr. Day stands six feet two inches high and weighs about 200 pounds. As an athlete he has a splendid record playing football, baseball and hockey. Mr. Motyer is a gifted student and will graduate with distinction at the approaching convocation in May, taking honors in mathematics. He is a fine manly fellow, and has a brilliant athletic record. Under his captaincy the university football team of 1904 won six or eight important victories, without a single defeat. His abilities, scholarship and character are such as to warrant confident expectations that he will uphold in a creditable manner at Oxford the credit of both Mt. Allison and Bermuda.

Since Mt. Allison is affiliated with Oxford University, no examination was necessary in the case of either of these appointments.
