O'Leary informed the court that he was just as bright this morning as he ever was, and that he had been drinking liquor for the past 25 years

The court then tried to arrange an hour that would be more suitable for the witness to appear in a better con-dition, and while trying to do this O'Leary caused a laugh when he said he commenced drinking as soon as the bars opened. The magistrate adjourned the case until tomorow morning at 9.30 o'clock, and incidently remarked that if a wit-ness was not in condition to give evi-dence he could be committed to jall until he was fit.
