BACK FROM TRIP TO BALMY SOUTH

Charles Hamilton, Whose home is In Yarmouth, Passed Away as Steamer Was Enlering Harber.

Charles Hamilton, second cook on the steamer Yarmouth, died suddenly from heart failure last evening as the steamer was entering the harbor. Hamilton was in his fifty-seventh year and leaves a wife and two children at his home in Yarmouth, N. S. The deceased was connected with the Yarmouth for a little over a week. About ten days ago he took the position of second cook, expecting to relieve C. D. Southern, the first cook, who intended to take a varation. The recent quarantine of the Yarmouth on account of the smallpox scare interfered with this. Up to last evening Hamilton seemed to be in excellent health except that he complained of a pain in his chest. Last night just after beginning the supper preparations, he complained of this pain and said he thought he was dying. The chief cook called the steward, who gave the man some brandy. Hamilton was then ordered below to his berth. His condition seemed to improve for a time, but at 8.15 death came suddenly.
