Sabbath School. BIBLE LESSONS. THIRD QUARTER.

(Condensed from Peloubet's Notes.) Lesson IV. July 26. John 3: 1-17. CHRIST AND NICODEMUS.

GOLDEN TEXT. "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." John 3: 16.

EXPLANATORY. I. THE RELIGIOUS INQUIRER. 1. "There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews."

2. "The same came to Jesus." This was probably during the Passover week, April 16, A. D. 27. He had seen Jesus hold discourse in the Temple and other miracles, and was questioning whether He, indeed, might not be the Messiah, and so came to learn and to inquire further.

3. "And he came to Him by night." This phrase is definite; but it would appear from John 7: 50 that he belonged to the Sanhedrin, a body of about seventy men, whose position was as dignified and as much respected as that of the United States Senate and the Supreme Court combined.

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"THAT WHICH IS OF THE FLESH IS BORN OF THE FLESH AND OF THE BLOOD AND OF THE WILL OF MAN." Jesus now lays down the great principle of God's universe on which His doctrine of the new birth is based, and which proves its necessity; namely, "like produces like."

"The wind bloweth." The term for "wind" in Hebrew and Aramaic, as well as in Greek, was also the term for "spirit," the immaterial in man being, in many passages, and spoken of as absorbed by the breath.

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"God sent not His Son... to condemn (rather, to judge) the world." For the world was lost and condemned for an already. "But that the world through Him might be saved," or may be saved, on complying with the conditions of salvation.
