# SHIPPING FINANCE

## PRODUCE PRICES IN CANADIAN CENTRES

Montreal, Jan. 6.—WHEAT—The market in Ontario is unchanged with prices quoted at 85 to 86 cents outside for No. 2 white and red winter; Manitoba wheat, the demand today was quiet and prices higher. All rail rates as follows: No. 1 northern, \$1.01 1/2; bay ports; No. 2 northern is quoted as 99 cents bay ports and No. 3 at 96 cents bay ports.

FLOUR—Winter wheat 60 per cent. patents are quoted at \$3.35 at the mills west. Manitoba flours are unchanged as follows: first patents, \$5.40; second patents, \$4.90 and strong bakers, \$4.70 on track.

OATS—Demand is quiet and offerings late No. 2 white, 34 to 34 1/2 cents on track Toronto, and at 32 cents outside; No. 2 western Canadian oats, 35 cents; bay ports and No. 3 quoted at 36 1/2 cents bay ports.

MILFEED—Ontario bran, \$19 to \$20; Ontario middling, \$22 to \$22.50; Manitoba bran, \$18 to \$20; Manitoba shorts, \$21 to \$22.

CHEESE—Receipts of cheese were 72 boxes as against one box a year ago. The local market is quiet but steady, westerns being quoted at 11 1/2 to 12 cents and easterns at 11 to 11 1/2 cents.

BUTTER—Receipts of butter were 201 packages against 223 a year ago. The local market is steady with choice quoted at 23 1/2 cents and current receipts at 23 1/2 to 24 1/2 cents pound.

EGGS—Receipts of eggs were 51 cases. Prices are firm under a continued good demand and offerings. New laid are scarce and sell at 50 to 55 cents dozen; select 32 cents and No. 1 at 27 cents dozen.

HAY—Choice grades of hay are in good demand on local account and as supplies are not heavy prices rule firm. No. 1 hay, \$11 to \$11.50; extra No. 2 \$10 to \$10.50; clover, \$7 to \$7.50; lower mixed, \$5.50 to \$6; No. 2, \$9 to \$9.50 car lots.
