WILL CONSIDER... H. G. Sears has Satisfactory Interviews with Officials of Provincial Department of Agriculture - Test Patches of Alfalfa will be Planted Near Fredericton - Well Pleased with Interest Manifested in His Plans.

H. G. Sears is well satisfied with the action of the officials of the Provincial Department of Agriculture in their desire to promote the growth of alfalfa in the province. Mr. Sears has had satisfactory interviews with Secretary Daggett and also with Mr. MacDougal, dairy superintendent in Fredericton on Friday last.

Mr. Sears met Mr. MacDougal and had a lengthy interview with him. Mr. MacDougal expressed the opinion that alfalfa could be planted and grown with success in the province. While no detailed plan of action has yet been taken it is likely that an effort will be made to form alfalfa orders, as is done in other sections.

Speaking of alfalfa culture, Mr. Sears said: "I am deeply gratified with the assurance received from the Provincial Department of Agriculture that my efforts in regard to alfalfa culture will be forwarded to the highest authorities on every farm in New Brunswick."

"The sooner the farmer becomes aware of what is placed at his disposal for the growth of this plant and makes it his ambition to take advantage of the facilities through the board of agriculture for its cultivation, the nearer the goal for which he strives will be found, and I would suggest that the farmers get in touch with the Provincial Department of Agriculture."

I sincerely hope that the few articles on alfalfa I have written and that the press have kindly published, will have the effect of stimulating a well organized effort on the part of our agricultural communities to study and successfully grow alfalfa on their farms in New Brunswick.

In concluding my articles on alfalfa culture, I anticipate having met home province for the West within the next few days. I wish to acknowledge the many kindly courtesies and hearty receptions I have met while here. To

the press, the Premier, the representative of Queens County, the energetic secretary of agriculture, Mr. J. B. Daggett, and friends generally for the assistance and countenance they have offered, I would return my sincere thanks, and I feel I may look back with the brightest of hopes to New Brunswick becoming under the auspices of a liberal policy now being pursued by the government, one of the most progressive and productive areas of the eastern section of our great country.

Important Suggestions in the Harvesting of Alfalfa Hay. 1. Alfalfa should be cut when the new sprouts or small shoots, which are found at the base of the plants, just begin to make their appearance. (The plants are just in the advanced stage of growth.)

These small shoots are the beginning of the second crop and grow very rapidly and it is most important that no time is lost in cutting, after the small shoots have been first located as they are the beginning of the second crop and grow very rapidly.

The demonstration work referred to in the following figures, prove, on the demonstration yield of corn from 95,467 acres in 15,663 farms was 35.4 bushels while the general average for the whole South was 19.6 bushels per acre, a difference of 80.6 per cent.

Do not put over 50 to 100 pounds of alfalfa in the feed. Alfalfa should be stored under cover where it will be protected from the weather and where it can be fed with the greatest convenience.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Canada has adapted this method of late years. Never stack alfalfa hay on the ground, but on an elevated bottom made of poles or brush, this will prevent spoilage and waste at the bottom of the stack, also have every stack topped with other material such as blue grass hay, or rain may soak into the alfalfa and cause great damage.
