Stricken While at Dinner in Hotel at Capital - Third Serious Attack from Same

Fredericton, N. B., Feb. 10—Hon. George J. Clarke, premier of New Brunswick, was suddenly seized with a serious illness while at dinner at the Barker House this evening.
