PARIS, June 14.—There were no indications to-day that the resolutions passed in the American Senate would affect the treaty plans in any manner, or that any effort would be made to separate the league of nations covenant from the treaty.

The program for the completion and presentation of the treaty has not been altered.

It is pointed out that even if it were the intention to separate the league and the treaty, it would constitute a task of many weeks.

ALLIED COUNCIL OF FIVE MET TO-DAY

PARIS, June 16.—Marshal Foch and other military leaders attended the meeting of the council of five to-day. The meeting developed the nature of a general windup of the German situation.

Memorial Church Proposed.

Hoping thereby to secure a lasting and dignified memorial to the members of the congregation of the Anglican Church of the Redeemer, London Ont. have launched a scheme to erect a new and imposing edifice to be known as the Redeemer War Memorial Church. The church which will be built at the corner of Adelaide and Grosvenor streets will be in commemoration of the heroism of Canadians who served with the British forces and especially of the gallantry of the members of their own congregation who donned khaki.

Face Murder Charge.

Referring to the proceedings in the alleged murder cases a Galt report says: Following the inquest at which a verdict was returned implicating them in the crime Ivan Petrov and Boyeff were charged in the Police Court with the murder of a Russian, John Sorokaty, whose body was found under a pile of stones on the sheldon farm near Galt. Both were committed to stand trial at the Fall Assizes.

As the result of the revelation of the crime to the police by Stoyko Boyeff, Ivan Petrov has been held for about two weeks on a charge of murder and Boyeff as a material witness. Boyeff signed a statement to the effect that he helped to bury the murdered Russian before he was dead, and thus resulted in him also being charged with murder.

Had Narrow Escape.

The engineer and fireman of Engine No. 2066 on the Toronto-Owen Sound branch of the C.P.R. had a narrow escape from a horrible death, coming up on the night train on Friday. The steam casing of the cylinders burst, letting the steam and water out into the fire box, and then the whole mass was hurled out into the cab of the engine. The engineer and the fireman got out by the window. The train was going about thirty miles an hour at the time and they were able to hang on the running board until the emergency brakes stopped the train. The accident occurred between Holland Centre and Chatsworth, and delayed the train for almost three hours.

Seven Ordained at London.

Seven of St. Peter's Seminarians were ordained to the Roman Catholic priesthood by Bishop M. F. Fallon, at St. Peter's Cathedral in London, Ont., Saturday. They will be assigned to their first appointments by the Bishop at the annual retreat of the priests of the diocese of London, to be held in Sandwich College during this week. The Bishop indicated that the announcements would probably be made on the 25th anniversary of his own ordination, on Thursday next.

The Bishop announced at the service that Pope Benedict has conferred the title of Domestic Prelate to his Holiness on Rt. Rev. C. C. McGee of Stratford, Rt. Rev. P. J. McKenna of London, Rt. Rev. T. T. West of St. Thomas, and Rt. Rev. C. C. Parent of Tilbury. A similar honor was granted to the late Rev. Joseph Kennedy of St. Mary's Church, London, but the Papal communication did not reach this city until six days after his death.

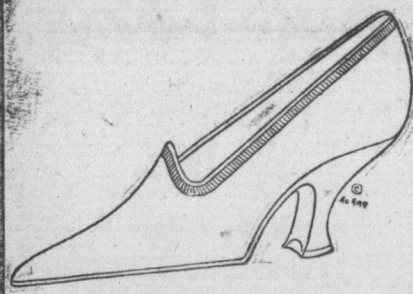
