

WYLIE, THOMAS, *M.D.* (*Simcoe.*)

Father, John Wylie, emigrated from Paisley, Scot., in 1830, and after residing a few years in Lower Can., settled in Tp. of Mariposa as a farmer. Mother was a native of Tyree, Argyleshire, Scot. B. in Toronto, 4 June, 1841. Ed. at the Public and Grammar Schools in Co. of Victoria, and at Dr. Rolph's Medical Sch., Toronto, where he graduated M.D. in 1866. M., 10 July, 1867, Catherine, second dau. of Malcolm Ferguson, Mariposa. First returned to Leg. Assem. at last g. e. A Liberal-Conservative. Believes in Prohibition with compensation, and if this impracticable, favors a restrictive license system.—*Stayner, Ont.*
