And you are with all usual solemnity to cause Our said Commission to be read and published at the first meeting of Our said Council, and you shall then and there take the Oaths appointed to be taken by an Act passed in the First year of the Reign of King George the First, intituled "An Act for the further security of His Majesty's "Person and Government, and the succession " of the Crown in the Heirs of the late Princess "Sophia, being Protestants, and for extinguish-"ing the hopes of the pretended Prince of "Wales and his open and concealed Abettors," as altered and explained by an Act passed in the Sixth year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled "An Act for altering the Oath "of Abjuration and the Assurance, and for "amending so much of an Act of Her late Ma-"jesty Queen Anne, intituled 'An Act for the "improvement of the Union of the two King-"doms, as after the time therein limited requires "the delivery of certain Lists and Copies therein " mentioned to Persons indicted of High Trea-"son or Misprision of Treason," or in lieu thereof the Oath required to be taken by an Act passed in the Tenth year of His late Ma-10 Geo. 4 cap. jesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An 7-Oath to be Act for the relief of His Majesty's Roman Catholic Subjects," according as the said for-mer Acts, or the said last mentioned Act, shall be applicable to your case; and you shall like-
