## Plugged into the Mississauga Library

The wind quintet from Western is a highly professional group, com a highly posed of University faculty and members of London Symphony Orchestra. The group which has been playing together since 1970, performed at Stratford Festival last summer and recently taped a per-formance for CBC, in the series Music to See, to be broadcast in April.

Instruments for Sunday's concert are oboe, flute, clarinet, horn and bassoon and the program includes pieces by Ibert, Reicha, Etler, Arnold, Taffanel and

The concert is part of a series sponsored by Mississauga Library, to provide inexpensive musical entertainment (50c admits the whole family) and at the same time provides an audience for up-and-coming

The visit by Peter Such and Walter Buczynski to central library is in the nature of a homecoming.

Such will talk about his latest book, Soundprints, just published by Clarke Irwin. The book had its beginning in 1970-72 when Such was writer-in-residence at Erindale College, and Walter Buczynski was musician-in-

The two got together and Such realized that no books had been written about composers of serious music

He set out to write one, and the result is Soundprints which describes the lives and music of Buczynski, Weinzweig, John Beckwith, Harry Somers, Norma Beecroft, and Murray Schafer

Such is now working on another book — a novel about the Beothuk Indians of Newfoundland. He also runs his own arts magazine. Impulse, and teaches in a Canadian studies program at Atkinson College, York University.


