## Plugged into the Mississauga Library

It's music week for Mississauga Libraries.

On Sunday, the wind quintet of University of Western Ontario performs at a Library-sponsored concert at Huron Park Theatre;

And on Monday, Mississauga Symphonic Association combines with the library to present author Peter Such and composer Walter Buczynski in a discussion of books, poetry and Canadian music, at central library. It's the Symphonic Association's first public event of the season.

The wind quintet from Western is a highly professional group, composed of University faculty and members of London Symphony Orchestra. The group which has been playing together since 1970, performed at Stratford Festival last summer and recently taped a performance for CBC, in the series Music to See, to be broadcast in April.

Instruments for Sunday's concert are oboe, flute, clarinet, horn and bassoon and the program includes pieces by Ibert, Reicha, Etler, Arnold, Taffanel and Farkas.

The concert is part of a series sponsored by Mississauga Library, to provide inexpensive musical entertainment (50¢ admits the whole family) and at the same time provides an audience for up-and-coming performers.

The visit by Peter Such and Walter Buczynski to central library is in the nature of a homecoming.

Such will talk about his latest book, Soundprints, just published by Clarke Irwin. The book had its beginning in 1970-72 when Such was writer-in-residence at Erindale College, and Walter Buczynski was musician-in-residence.

The two got together and Such realized that no books had been written about composers of serious music in Canada.

He set out to write one, and the result is Soundprints, which describes the lives and music of Buczynski, John Weinzweig, John Beckwith, Harry Somers, Norma Beecroft, and Murray Schafer.

Such is now working on another book — a novel about the Beothuk Indians of Newfoundland. He also runs his own arts magazine, Impulse, and teaches in a Canadian studies program at Atkinson College, York University.

Walter Buczynski continues to write music.

The discussion of Soundprints and allied topics begins at 7.30 p.m. and the public is invited to stay behind for an informal reception for the two men.

Another big event for Mississauga Libraries this week is the continuation of special activities for youngsters during spring break.

At Central Library on Thursday, at 2.30 p.m.,

youngsters get a chance to meet a policeman; there are movies for all ages at Burnhamthorpe Library at 10.30 a.m.; a magic show by Michael Wyvern at Clarkson-Lorne Park Library at 10.30 a.m.; folksinging for youngsters at Lakeview Library; and a puppet show at Western Library, also at 10.30 a.m.

On Friday, a top feature movie will be shown at Central Library at 2.30 p.m. Posters are up in the library.

Central has a movie The Red Balloon, where a boy tames a balloon that begins to live a life of its own. It will be shown Saturday at 10.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.
