they appear to be worthy
of approval on their
merits, in respect to which,
however, I observe that Mr
Gilkison, Visiting Superin-
tendent, has suggested
certain alterations. Any
such alterations can only
be made by the Tribe in
Council, and do not form
the subject of alteration
by the Governor in Council.

There is one important
feature, however, to which
I desire to call attention,
and that is, that the By-laws
impose fines, ~~for~~ breach
of them which, it is also
proposed, shall be enforced
under the Summary Con-
victions act of Canada.

This is not competent
without express legislative
sanction.
