In further reference to the sale by William Johnson of Walpole Island, of lumber belonging to the Department, I beg to say that I have been able to learn from Mr. William Biden, that this lumber was purchased by one of his men without his knowledge: that the lumber was taken over on a debt which William Johnson owed the firm: the debt being for matching, and planing lumber which was put in a small house that Johnson built, and which is now located on the lot which was transferred to Earle Sands. In view of this I beg to recommend that no further action be taken.
