

Leader of the Liberal Opposition in Parliament, October 1919 to December 1921; Prime Minister, December 1921 to present.

Mr. King has devoted his life to public service and government administration; has had wide experience and success as a conciliator in industrial disputes; is author of Canadian legislation respecting the adjustment of industrial disputes, investigation of combines, monopolies, mergers and trusts; has engaged extensively in research on subjects affecting industrial relations, some of the results of which have been embodied in his "Industry and Humanity", 1916; was Director of investigation of industrial relations under auspices of Rockefeller Foundation, 1914-191⁷; during same period, and subsequently, rendered extensive service in furthering continuous and maximum production of essential war supplies through the adjustment of relations between workers and employers in several of the most important war industries in America.

Mr. King has represented the Government of Canada in negotiations with the Governments of India, Japan and China on the subject of Oriental immigration; and was one of the
