 "May. The Livery Stable Keeper as-  
 "sented to this, provided he would  
 "give a chattel mortgage on both  
 "of the horses (his own and the  
 "purchased horse) and the harness,  
 "in order to secure payment on  
 "the horse and harness sold. Devacha  
 "consented; a Solicitor drew up the  
 "mortgage and the instrument was  
 "duly signed on the 21st day of  
 "February. Payment was to be made  
 "on the 1st of May.

" It seems that Devacha was  
 "unfortunate in the work for which  
 "he wanted the horse, and when  
 "the time for payment came he  
 "was unprepared to meet his obli-  
 "gations.
