Dear Sir,-

I beg to state that the Department is in receipt of vouchers from the Acting Indian Agent for the Carlton Indian Agency at Leask, Sask., covering the emergency employment of a stenographer for two and a half days in December, 1918, at \$2.00 a day and ten and a half days in January, 1919, at the same rate, amounting in all to \$26.00.

The Acting Agent states that the stenographer employed was a Mrs. Green whose husband is overseas and that it was necessary owing to the volume of work in his office to secure temporary assistance in order to keep up with the work. Her services were satisfactory and the rate of pay seems reasonable.
