

lying down in his cell upstairs. I asked
 Corporal Armstrong who it was & he said it
 was a man named Cummings. About
 7 or 7.30 pm. the same evening, I returned
 to the Detention Barracks and was let in
 by the warden. I then saw Propper Hawthorne.
 He was in the warden's office. I went into the
 kitchen with Propper Hawthorne, with the
 permission of Corporal Armstrong. At this
 time Miss Buchanan was in the Detention
 Barracks also & afterwards Miss Buchanan
 & Propper Hawthorne went upstairs, but I do
 not know whether they had permission from
 the accused to do so. They were upstairs
 from half-an-hour to an hour. Miss
 Buchanan & myself left the Detention Barracks
 about 9 or 9.30 pm.

I again visited the Detention Barracks
 about two weeks later, at about 7 pm.
 & was admitted by Corporal Armstrong.
 I had telephoned the same day to Armstrong
 who arranged to admit me. I was again
 accompanied by Miss Buchanan & came to
 see Hawthorne & Cummings. I saw
 Hawthorne in the warden's office but not
 Cummings. I saw the latter in his cell
 & was admitted to it by Corporal Armstrong.
 I was in the cell about half-an-hour.
 I do not know whether the door was closed
 or open. I saw Hawthorne again, in the
 kitchen the same evening. I left the
 Detention Barracks about 9 pm.

I have visited the Detention Barracks
 about seven or five times altogether.
