I asked him if it was his intention, if he was sent back for an opportunity to take the innoculation, whether he would accept it. He stated that he would not, as long as he lived, take another innoculation. I asked him if he had any religious or medical reason for refusing it, and he said 'NO'. Thereupon I remanded him to the Commanding Officer's Orders."
