

- Q.34 I just want you to think carefully, Detective Sergeant Doney, you say that after your interview with Major Gee you went to Boots Chemist. Whereabouts did you go?
A.34 I went to Boots Chemist, South Street, Worthing, and saw a Mr. Simmons and took possession of some photographs from that shop.
- Q.35 Were those the photographs you were talking about?
A.35 Yes, these are the photographs obtained from South Street.
- Q.36 Can you recognize those photographs and negatives?
A.36 Those are the actual photographs I took possession of at Boots Chemist, South Street, Worthing.
- Q.37 You say you took possession of them. From whom?
A.37 From Mr. Simmons.
- Judge Advocate: These snapshots 1 to 14 will be marked Exhibits "H"1 to "H"14 inclusive. The 8 negatives will be marked "I" on the envelope.
- Q.38 What steps, if any, did you take after your interview with Mr. Simmons at Boots Chemist?
A.38 I took steps to trace the person who took the photographs to Boots to be developed. The result, I later saw the accused at the Worthing Police Station.
- Q.39 Do you recall just when that was?
A.39 It was early in December.
- Q.40 What happened when you saw the accused?
A.40 I told him the nature of the offence.
- Q.41 What did you show him?
A.41 I showed him Exhibits "G"1 to "G"15 and the ones I recovered from Boots, South Street, "H"1 to "H"14 and asked him if he wished to make a statement and cautioned him and he made a statement which I have already produced.
- Judge Advocate: You say the statement was obtained freely and voluntarily, without threat, etc.
- Witness: Yes.
- Judge Advocate: What is this document?
Witness: This is the statement which I took. The date was the 2nd December, 1942.
- Judge Advocate: This statement will be marked Exhibit "J".
- Q.42 Who was this statement signed by?
A.42 By the accused.
- Q.43 Were you present at the signing?
A.43 Yes.
- Witness cross-examined by the Defending Officer.
Q.44 Almost immediately when T.M.S. Dompierre came back off leave he went down to see you?
A.44 Yes, I made arrangements through the Commanding Officer.
- Q.45 He was quite willing to give you all the information required?
A.45 Yes, he was very straightforward and willing.
- Q.46 Are you quite sure that you showed both lots of pictures, that is Exhibits "G"1 to "G"15 and "H"1 to "H"14 to T.M.S. Dompierre?
A.46 Yes.
- No re-examination by the Prosecutor.
- No questions by the Court.
