



CONDITIONS OF SALE

1. The highest bidder to be the buyer, and if any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the lot so in dispute shall be immediately put up again and re-sold.

2. The lots to be taken at the buyers expense and risk within three days from the conclusion of the sale, and the purchase money to be absolutely paid, or otherwise settled for to the satisfaction of the Auctioneers, on or before delivery; in default of which, Messrs. Oct. Lemieux & Co., will not hold themselves responsible if the lots be lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser.

3. In preparing the Catalogue, care has been taken to make the description of every book accurate, but the sale of any volume or lot is not to be set aside on account of any error in the description. The books will be on exhibition three days before the sale.

4. To prevent inconvenience in delivery and inconvenience in the settlement of the purchases, no lot can, on any account, be removed during the sale.

5. Upon failure of complying with the above conditions, all lots un-cleared within the time aforesaid shall be re-sold by public or private sale, and the deficiency, if any, attending such re-sale, shall be made good by the defaulter at the sale, together with all charges attending the same. This condition is without prejudice to the right of the Auctioneers to enforce the contract made at this sale, without such re-sale if they think fit.

Universities and public institutions unable to be present at the Sale, may have their purchases made for them by the Auctioneers.
