ment of Salvation; and this is called a Change of Raiment, for Sin and Guilt which by Nature and Backflidings cover the Soul are called its filtby Rags.

Upon the Return of the penitent Prodigal, the Father ordered the *beft Robe* to be put upon him, &c.

- " Take off his Cloaths of Shame and Sin,
- " (The Father gives Command)
- " Drefs him in Garments white and clean,

" With Rings adorn his Hand.

Now Chrift hath clothed his Church with the Rightcoufnefs both of Juftification and Sanctification; for befides this Robe of Righteoufnels and Garment of Salvation, there is the Garment of internal Holinefs, the new Man, or new Nature confifting of the feveral Graces of the Spirit, which is put on as a Garment, and makes Believers all glorious within. For he hath clothed them with Salvation as a Garment, and with Righteoufnefs, as with a Robe.
