

it as a dumping ground, would require an expenditure of \$250,000 for cribbing and \$175,000 for a breakwater.—The following works have been recommended: Sewers:—Gibson avenue, from Yonge to a point 395 feet west, cost \$1,100; Manchester avenue, Ossington avenue to Shaw street, \$1,095; Wallace and Lee avenue, \$3,730. Asphalt pavements: King street, from 234 feet west of Jefferson avenue to Dufferin street, \$10,045; King street, Dufferin to Queen, \$47,207. Tar macadam roadways: Lake Shore road, from G. T. K. tracks to Humber bridge, \$13,095; Queen street, from Roncesvalles avenue to 1,000 feet west, \$1,550. The construction of several concrete sidewalks has also been recommended.—Building permits have been granted as follows: L. W. Ingram, three two and a half-storey brick and roughcast dwellings, north side Elliot street, cost \$4,500; George Phillips, two and a half-storey, stone and brick dwellings, 552 and 554 Huron

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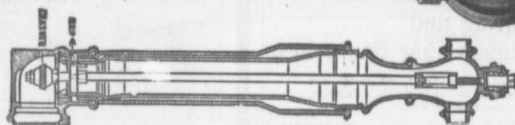
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
