Petition of *William Forsyth & Co. Hall, Lewis & Odber* and others, presented.

A Petition of *William Forsyth and Co. Hall, Lewis and Odber* and others, Merchants, was presented to the House by Mr. Hill and read, setting forth, that by an Act passed in the 24th Year of his Majesty's Reign, an Excise Duty was imposed of One Penny per Pound on all refined Sugar, and five Shillings per Hoghead on all Porter imported into this Province ; that the Petitioners imported large Quantities of the before mentioned Articles, and in Conformity to said Act paid or secured to the Excise Office such Duties as arose on the same so imported, that after the Importation so made they severally, legally exported considerable Quantities of Sugar and Porter to *New Brunswick, Island Cape Breton, and Island St. John* as per Schedule annexed, on which they conceive they are entitled to a Draw-back of the Duties by the seventh Section of the before recited Act, and praying they may be allowed it, amounting to £62. 15s.

Petition of *William Forsyth and Co.* presented.

A Petition of *William Forsyth and Co.*, was presented by Mr. Hill and read, setting forth, that the Petitioners on the 1st *January* 1789 exported to great Britain a considerable Quantity of Flax Seed the Growth of this Province, and of the Year 1788 as per Certificates annexed, and on which a Bounty of one Shilling per Bushel to the Raifer, and six Pence per Bushel to the Exporter was payable, and praying Payment of said Bounties, amounting together to the sum of £26. 9s.
