

Mr. President, and Gentlemen of His Majesty's Council;

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly;

Resume your official duties, and, guided by an impartial and honorable desire to the fulfilment of them, uphold the character of the Country, and your own credit.

The Speech being ended, His Excellency was pleased to retire, and the House of Assembly having withdrawn, the President reported His Excellency's Speech, which being read by the Clerk—

Resolved—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, to return His Excellency the thanks of this House for his Speech delivered this day;

Ordered, that the Honorables *Charles Worrell, John Brecken* and *J. S. Smith*, be a Committee to prepare a Draft pursuant to the above Resolution.

On motion, Ordered, that the Honorables *George Wright* and *Ambrose Lane* be a Committee to revise the Journals of this House each day.

On motion, Ordered, that the Honorables *Charles Worrell* and *J. S. Smith* be a Committee to examine into, and report upon such Laws as are near expiring.

On motion, Ordered, that the Rev. Louis C. Jenkins be appointed Chaplain, and that he be requested to attend the Council to-morrow at One o'clock, and each succeeding day during the Session, for the purpose of reading Prayers,

His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor requiring the personal attendance of *J. P. Collins*, Esquire, the Clerk of the Council, Mr. John Ogle Nantes was appointed to act as Clerk during the present Session, and having taken the Oath of Allegiance and also the Oath of Office, took his Seat accordingly.

Adjourned until 1 o'clock to-morrow.
