Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the following Petitions were severally read :-

Of the Municipal Council of the Township of Nottawasaga, in the County of Simcoe; praying for the amendment of the Assessment Laws of Upper Canada.

Of the Municipal Councils of the Townships of Oro and Innisfil, in the County of Simcoe; severally praying for the incorporation of "The Simcoe County Bank."

Of the Municipal Council of the United Counties of York and Peel; of Sumuel Gunn and others, of the City of Toronto; and of the Corporation of the City of Hamilton; severally praying against the passing of the Act to amalgamate the Buffalo and Lake Huron, and Grand Trunk Railway Companies.

Of David Dunkerley and others, of Dunkam, in the County of Drummond; praying for the redress of certain gridvances connected with the subject of Protestant Education in Lower Canada.

Of the Canadian Board of Management of "The English and Canadian Mining Company," [limited]; and of the Honorable Charles Alleyn and others, Shareholders of the said Company; severally praying for the passing of an Act to incorporate the said Company in Canada.

Of the Moore Agricultural Society of the County of Lambton; praying for the amendment of the Agricultural Act of Upper Canada.

Of the Municipal Council of the Second Division of the County of Charlevoix; praying for aid for the repair of a certain road in the said County.

Of the Reverend J. Maurault and others, of the Parish of St. Thomas de Pierreville, County of Yamaska; praying for an Act to change the tenure of the lands held by the Abenakis Indians at St. François de Salles and for other purposes.

Of Richard Atkinson Clarke, of the Town of St. Catharines, in the County of Lincoln; praying for the payment of certain arrears of salary due to his late father, the Reverend James Clarke.

Of Henry Meyer and others, of the City of Montreal; praying to be incorporated as "The German Society of the City of Montreal."

And of Patrick McGuire and others, of Cobourg; praying that the Roman Catholic minority in Upper Canada may, in the event of a Federal Union of the British North American Provinces, be placed on the same footing in regard to Education: I subjects as the Protestant minority in Lower Canada.

The Honorable Sir E. P. Taché presented to the House a Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, dated the sixth instant, praying His Excellency to cause to be laid before this House a Statement shewing the amount contributed to the Common School Fund created by the Act 12 Victoria, Chapter 200, from the sales of land in Upper and Lower Canada respectively.
