The House of Assembly, anxious to increase the intercourse between this the most ancient and loyal colony belonging to her Majesty, and the parent Country, and to do every thing else in its power to perpetuate the connection, most humbly request your Excellency will be pleased to permit the Assembly to appropriate a portion of the public Revenues for the purpose of encouraging the establishment of Steam Navigation between this colony and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

Resolved,—That the said address be adopted and engrossed.

Adopted & engrossed.

Ordered,—That Mr. Morris and the Solicitor General be a committee to present the same to his Excellency.

Committee to present it.

Mr. Morris gave notice that, on an early day, he should move an address to his Excellency the Governor, praying his Excellency would direct the Attorney-General to institute a criminal prosecution against the printer of the *Times* newspaper, for the insertion in that paper of a foul libel, charging the members of this House with disloyalty to their Sovereign, &c.
