Young Man Walked from Norwich to city for that Purpose.

Quite a romance was brought to light with the return of the soldiers to the city from camp last night. A week ago last Saturday morning a young man presented himself at the depot and applied for enlistment. He was examined and accepted, giving his age as 19 years. After sending the new recruit to camp, those in charge were surprised to receive a visit from the parents, who reside in the vicinity of Norwich, requesting that their son be discharged, basing their claim on the fact that he was under age. They were persuaded, however, to let the matter rest until the arrival of the battalion in the city. Last night a consultation of the boys and his parents was held in the presence of some members of the battalion, when the following story was told:

On the Friday evening previous to his enlistment the young man set out from home and walked the whole distance here, and was found waiting admission when Privates Tutt and Hodge arrived at the headquarters at 7 o'clock and was immediately signed up. After some discussion, during which the soldier declared his intention to remain in the army, his parents finally acquiesced, and he is now the proudest wearer of the uniform in the city.

**G. T. R. RAISES  
MEN'S SALARIES**

Engineers and Firemen Receive Substantial Increase in Pay.

Arrangement Satisfactory to All Has Been Reached.

Montreal, Oct. 16.—The Grand Trunk Railway Company today issued a statement to the effect that after lengthy negotiations the locomotive engineers and firemen on the G.T.R. system have been granted a 3 per cent increase in pay, "with the result that an agreement has been reached mutually satisfactory to the interests of both parties concerned."  
The increase was not stated, but representatives of the unions concerned state that the increase amounts to 15 per cent, spread over three thousand men. A few weeks ago the Grand Trunk increased the pay of the conductors, brakemen, baggage men and yardmen, five thousand men participating in the increase.

**HE HELPED TO  
START THE WAR**

One of Assassins of Archduke Ferdinand Dies in Prison.

Berlin, Oct. 17.—(By wireless to Sayville.)—Nedjo Kerovic one of the conspirators in the assassination of Archduke Francis Ferdinand, held apparent to the Austrian throne, in 1914, has died in a military prison, says a report from Sarajevo, Bosnia given out by the Overseas News Agency.  
Three of the conspirators in the assassination of the archduke were executed in February, 1915, and Jankov Zilovio and Nedjo Kerovic were sentenced to imprisonment for life but it was later commuted to twenty years. Gario Brinip, the actual assassin, was sentenced to twenty years in prison.

Will Sell For a Price.  
Boston, Mass., Oct. 17.—"Somebody must have had a dream," said President Lanni, of the Boston American League Baseball Club yesterday, when asked if it was true he had sold to a syndicate composed of Boston business men headed by J. J. McCarthy, Lanni stated he had numerous offers from prospective buyers, but none reached his figure. He will sell if he offered enough, he added.
