Which Peace Edvoys At Portsmouth, N.H., Keep in Touch With Home. A correspondent at Portsmouth,

N. H., writes:
So complete are the telegraph and cable arrangements which have been made for the distinguished foreigners who are to meet here to try to make peace that, whether they be in the conference room at the Portsmouth Navy Yard or in their quarters in the Wentworth Hotel, they will be in touch on a mignite's notice with St., Petersburg and Tokio and with Oyster, Ray and

and Tokio and with St. Retersburg and Tokio and with Oyster Bay and all the capitals of Europe.

The Posial Telegraph Cable Com-pany will transmit Japanese messages to San Francisco by way of New York, and then over its own Commercial cable to Manila. At Manila the East-ern extension sends them to Tokia

and then over its own Commercial cable to Manila. At Manila the Eastern extension sends them to Tokio.

The Postal, too, has wires direct to the hotel and into the rooms of the envoys, a heavy ten wire cable having been stretched from Portsmouth. Cable messages from St. Petersburg sent by this company will be telegraphed to Canso, Noya Scotia, and scalled to Waterford, Ireland, Thence, by cable and telegraph, they will be forwarded cross the Continent.

Western Union messages for St. Petersburg will be sent overland to Hearts Content N.F., and thence by cable to Valentia, Ireland. By telegraph and cable ther will be forwarded to London, where the Eastern Telegraph Company will transmit them across the Continent to the Russian capital.

Messages intended for Tokio will be

thence to Nagasaki, whence they are forwarded by telegraph to Tokio.

Diplomatic Messages.

The composing, sending, receiving and transcribing of diplomatic cable messages is a slow process, although the transmission of the messages is done very swiftly. Each country has its special code. The messages, as written out, represent a series of groups of figures. Thus the figures 02579, following a code word, might represent "Nothing doing," or phrase of even greater length. The secretary would first have to make up the dewould first have to make up the desired message into these combinations

of five figure groups.

After they have been transmitted to he other side and received by the home Governments another secretary will have to take these groups of figures, and following the key word in the code book, write out the full mes-

This, as may be imagined, is a edious task, and if there is a great deal of communication between the envoys and their Governments the time consumed in sending and receiving messages will materially lengthen the time of the conference.

to be cabled, elaborate preparations have been made for the sending of press matter to all quarters of the earth. Press correspondents are arriving from Japan and all European countries, not to speak of the small army here to represent American newspapers.

The ownership of a Bible in Thibet is a matter for a municipality, since the sacred volume consists of 108 volumes of 1000 pages each, 225 volumes of commentaries absolutely necessary to the understanding of the text, and several hundred volumes of revelations supplementing the Bible proper.

The Bible is printed from wooden.

The Bible is printed from wooden blocks engraved by hand, and for the protest storage of these plates a special city has been built, ach volume having a house to fiself. One tribe of Mongols paid 7,000 oxen for a copy and furnished an escort and a dozen yaks for its safe transportation.

Sour cream may be used in any reci-pe for cake or breakfast breaks in which sweet milk, baking powder and shortening are required. The same quantity of cream is taken as when milk is called for, but the quantity of shortening is reduced and the baking powder is replaced by baking soda int necessary of the last ingredient is in direct proportion to the quantity and acidity of the cream, the quantity and acidity of the cream, the usual rule being one teaspoonful (level) of soda to one pint of thick sour cream. The soda is usually dissolved in a small teaspoonful of boiling water, added to the cream, stirred until the latter is foamy, then turned at once into the dry mixture. If the cream is well sourced, the ingredients rapidly well soured, the ingredients rapidly mixed and the oven properly heated the result will be very satisfactory, concludes a cooking expert.
