

We find our boiler capacity somewhat unsuitable for the duty, which it is called upon to proform, now necessary to keep both boilers almost constantly under pressure, which causes the making of repairs, to this vital and important part of the system, vrey difficult and we think the addition of another large boiler would be a good and profitable investment.

500 tons of coal, 400 cords of wood, and 450 loads of mill refuse, have been purchased during the year, there s now on hand about 175 tons of coal and 75 cords of wood, for current con-

In conclusion we have every reason to believe, that our Electric Light system is giving general satisfaction.
