C. L. B. Cadets

To-morrow, November 11th, St. Martin's Day, the Church Lads Brigade celebrates its thirty-second birthday. It was formed by Lt. Col. W. M. Gee on this date 1891. To-day its Companies are doing splendid work throughout the whole of the British Empire. Founded on the principle of "Every lad for Christ" and with the following object: "The advancement of Christ's Kingdom among lads of all classes; the promotion of reverence, discipline, and self-respect and all that tends towards true Christian manliness," this organization for "boys" has survived the ups and downs of thirty-two strenuous years of organization and is now at last firmly established. Our founder, Col. Gee, has passed along the great lone trail, but his glorious work survives, carried on successfully by observing the principles of the founder.

Newfoundland had the honour of enrolling the first Overseas Company in 1892. This was due to Sgt. Harold R. Blackler, whose Regimental Number was No. 1. The late Rt. Rev. Llewellyn Jones, Bishop of Newfoundland, gave the movement his heartiest support. The Charter is dated 18th November, 1892 and A. Co., No. 119, B. Co., No. 703 secured their charters on February 6th, 1896. Heart's Content Company was organized August 10th, 1910, known officially as St. Mary's Company No. 2904. To the late Major Melville the first C.O., Captain C. Wearing Hayward now of British Columbia who is the oldest officer living, the Rev. J. S. Thompson, the first Chaplain, to Lt. Col. W. H. Franklin, D.S.O., then Capt. Franklin, Major W. R. Warren, now holding the office of Nfld. Prime Minister who joined in 1897, and ex-Lt. Col. Goodridge supported by the generosity of churchmen and lady friends, the Nfld. Brigade is heavily indebted for its early stage of establishment. The first drill Sgt. was Sgt. George Cockshott of the Nfld. Constabulary, and the first Bandmaster was the veteran co-member of the Royal Nfld. Regt. Bandmaster Bennett of Bennett's famous band. Amongst the first few lads joining were H. R. Blackler, Alan and George Cane, Walter and Edward Reid, Edward Wills, J. Newman, Fred. C. Grant, Geo. R. Williams, Walter Coffin, John Hussey, Henry Lewis, F. Chislett, Jack Collier, Charlie Goodridge, J. Garland, John Hayward, G. H. Press, Chas. Snow, Chas. Lush, W. Cursey, Larry Moore, Chas. Peters, R. G. Macdonald, William H. Lewis, John Hooker and others.

The first meeting place for drill was in the basement of Springdale St. School, and as Allan Cane says, "the acorn planted has grown into a British oak." Percie Johnson when the Brigade was turned out "of school" saved the day and offered a portion of his premises as a drill shed, and the Brigade does not forget his kindness. In April, 1893 Lady Bowring organized the first tableau and dramatic entertainment for the Brigade's funds. Amongst the performers were the late James Smith, Organist; Misses McKay, Mary Brenner and West; Messrs. W. H. Rennie, W. H. Green, Chas. McKenzie Harvey, Fred L. Marriott also took part in the performance. During the years that followed the Brigade was always maintaining strenuously their motto, "Fight the Good Fight." To Capt. N. Snow, who established with Surgeon Major Herbert Rendell's help and Sir Edgar Bowring's generosity, the first section of the Brass Band, which was increased as the years went by, the Brigade expresses their thanks.

To the firm of Harvey & Co., who placed their old Butterine factory as a drill shed to carry on with and to the senior partner of the firm, Sir Joseph Outerbridge, the Brigade's first Colonel we are thankful for many favours. To Sir Joseph the Brigade is indebted for securing the first C.L.B. Armoury on King's Road. This action cannot be forgotten as it placed the organization on a permanent basis. After many years on King's Road and under Lieut. Col. Robert G. Rendell's guiding hand with heroic pluck assisted by the late Mrs. R. G. Rendell and many friends, Col. Rendell "burnt his bridges" and determined to build the present and best Church Lads Brigade Armoury in the British Empire at Harvey Road, St. John's, Nfld. Col. R. G. Rendell's pluck and energy was marvellous! The building debt was fully paid off after some years of hard work, and with fifteen hundred dollars to the Brigade's credit in the Bank, the Armoury magnificently equipped—worth forty thousand dollars—he asked leave to retire and turn over his command, Col. Rendell also established the C.L.B. Savings Bank, which is still prosperous and encouraging thrift. He was followed by one of the most experienced officers in the C.L.B., Major Richard F. Goodridge, who was promoted to Lieut. Col. and who magnificently "carried on" the good work until he had given in all twenty-five years of constant loyal service. Officers come and officers go, each leaving their footprints on the sands of time; slowly but surely by their efforts they have built better than they knew.

Lt. Col. Walter F. Rendell, C.B.E. is now O.C. and while the Brigade in Nfld. is not over supplied with

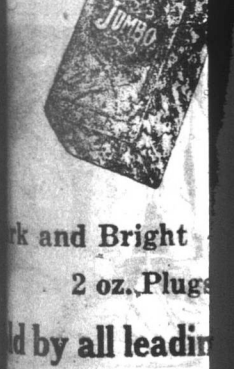
