Three big deals in Calgary hotel property were consummated on Tuesday, when the Arlington, Dominion and Grand Central hotels were turned over to new proprietors.

The deal for the Grand Union hotel was put through by H. M. Spian & Co., the vendors being La Pierre & Anthony, and the purchasers Lacey Bros., of Fort William, Ont., who paid \$65,000 for the lease of eight years, the interior furnishings, and the good will.

The deal for the Dominion hotel was made some days ago but the property was only handed over to Harry Aitken and Mr. Siedman, the new proprietors, yesterday.

The change in the ownership of the Arlington hotel will result in an extensive addition being built to that hotel at a cost of upwards of \$40,000.
