A .- I should think that to boil coffee and bottle it, making a very strong solution, to be weakened with hot water procured en route, would answer

admirably for a beverage. To use a cupful of coffee to a quart of water should be about the right proportion, and you will probably require about three quarts to carry you through the journey.
