NEW YORK, Oct. 11.-Facing the issue with the Yankees by powerful work with the stick, the Giants evened the world's series count today, taking the sixth game by the score of 8 to 5. ## Horse For Work RUGBY FEVER EPIDEMIC IN LONDON THIS FALL

Schools Creating New Interest in Game and Filling O. R. F. U. Gap by Developing New Following.

London has never had the rugby fever as strong as it has this year. Although the city hasn't got an O. R. F. U. entry, something that has happened but rarely since rugby was introduced into Western Ontario, the schools are taking it up more generally than they ever did, and are developing future rugby greatness for London, as well as a rugby following.

Starting with Western U. with an intermediate entry in the Intercollegiate, London boasts two entries in the newly-formed Oxford and Middlesex Interscholastic Rugby Union in the L. C. I. and Technical squads.

### 208,063 Have Attended the Six Games.

NEW YORK, Oct. 11.—With at NEW YORK, Oct. 11.—With at least two more games to be played, new financial records are certain to be made in the present world's series struggle between the Yankees and Giants. Today 34,283 spectators paid \$112,234. This gives a total attendance of 208,063 for six games and a total gate of \$685,897, which is within \$36,607 of the record total for the full eightgame series between Cincinnati and Chicago in 1919.

Now that the players have ceased to share in the profits of the series, the club owners' division are mounting rapidly, the aggregate share for six games being \$290,413.72. The club owners' share today was \$95,398.90, and that of the advisory board \$16,835.10, making a grand total to date of \$102,871.05 for the latter.
