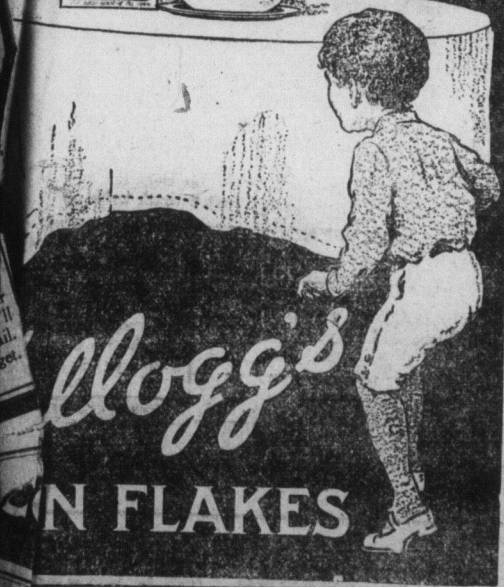

INJURED BY AUTO.

Cecil Chamberlain, the nine-year-old son of W. While Mr. Grubler was in the field making a fence, his little five-year-old son was playing about and as the father was in the act of driving a fence stake with an axe, the little fellow ran up behind him unnoticed and as Mr. Grubler was about to drive the stake, he struck the child on the temple, inflicting a terrible gash with the sharp blade. Mr. Grubler quickly carried the child to the house and a doctor was hastily telephoned for. In the meantime Mrs. Grubler did what she could to stop the flow of blood. Upon the arrival of Dr. Moore it was found necessary to administer chloroform before the wound could be attended to.

MORNING TRAIN NOT TAKEN OFF.
