The transports of delight of the people at the proclamation of Constitutional Government are now being supplanted by a movement in favor of the Sheri Laws and the Sultan, which it is expected may lead to a conflict between Christians and Moslems. The wave of fanaticism which originated at Adana some ten days ago apparently is spreading generally through the eastern provinces.

The Christian villages in the Villayetes of Aleppo and Sivas have been attacked by Kurds, Circassians and Nomads and the inhabitants are imploring the Porte to send troops for their protection.
