agents and padrones.

They came to Canada under a padrone last spring under promise of work from a labor agent to whom they paid the sum of \$50 for his trouble in getting it for them. The gang was composed of thirty men, and the work was located on the Trent Valley Canal, the stipulation being that the pay was to be from \$1.25 to \$1.50 per day. When they got to the scene of the work only half were employed, the remaining fifteen being told that there was nothing for them. nothing for them.

The fifteen who had been left out in the cold then came up to Toronto and interviewed once more the labor agent who had got their money in the first place. He had a contract with another padone, and through his assistance got another commission out of them and sent them on to the Montreal Short Line, at the same time to the Moutreal Short Line, at the same time telling them that there was enough work for them there to last all summer. When the men got there they found, after a few days on the job, that they had again been decrived. The left once more for Toronto to fall into the hands of their old acquaintance the labor agent.

The unfortunate fifteen soon found out that hey would, if they stayed there, become the laves of the padrone, so they quit in a body and made their way to Toronto where, luckily at themselves, they found a friend willing to elp them.
