T. C. P.'s Significant Remarks on the Future of Hockey in the Woodbine Toronto Meet.

In the initial number of Athletic Life, a new local monthly, published in the interests of Canadian sports, there appears an interesting article on sports and pastimes. Prof. Goldwin Smith discusses learnedly on athletic sports. "Time Heels," tells about the benefits and pleasures of curling.
