OBITUARY.

REV. HOWARD H. ROACH.

The death occurred at St. John on Wednesday evening last of Rev. H. Roach, pastor of the Main St. Baptist Church, and son of Mr. J. F. Roach, of Clarence, resulting from a complication of illnesses after an acute illness of only ten days.

Born at Clarence, Annapolis, thirty-seven years ago, he had a classical school course, entered Horton Academy at Wolfville, and from there went, in 1885, to Acadia University, where he attended college he prepared for a time at Annapolis, then returned to Wolfville. At the end of his first year in college his health failed, and he was compelled to leave for a time.

He remained with the Tabernacle Church till October, 1903, when he accepted a call to Main Street Baptist Church, which pulpit he has since filled. He is the second minister of the church to die in active service, the other being Rev. Dr. Corey, who had filled the pulpit only a few weeks.
